Planning and Learning

What a fun couple of months we have had! The children absolutely loved our baking topic where they were busy making lots of tasty treats including homemade bread, soup and cakes. This also led into our spooktacular experiences throughout Halloween where the children continued to follow their baking and mixing skills into making spooky biscuits, pumpkin soup and edible spiders. Exploring measurements and mixing skills continued while making poisonous potions and spells in their cauldrons throughout the nursery.

As we celebrated Halloween and fireworks during our darker nights, the children became interested in the local environment and the changes that have occurred during the colder months. We discussed the changes in the temperature of the weather and how the darker nights begin sooner in the winter. This led into a focus on what we see, hear and feel during the darker and colder months. This led into opportunities to explore the habitats and food of the animals and provide experiences for the children to create these.

Our interests then began to move into wildlife and in particular birds. During November we made bird cakes to feed the birds and explored the birds in our garden and the noises that they make. We also listened out for the birds on our visit to the Stick Man Trail.

As the weather changed and we had ice and snow in our garden we explored what happens to the birds in colder weather. Penguins then made an appearance and we enjoyed making penguins with art materials. We also created our own "bird hide" and using binoculars could watch the birds. Rhymes like "Peter and Paul" and stories about birds helped us develop our literacy.
