

Pupil Voice & Playground Improvements

Pupil voice is vitally important to ensure children feel their opinions are heard, taken seriously and acted upon wherever possible. Our pupils shared that they would like playground and outdoor learning to be improved. All children have been consulted and they are beginning to see some of their ideas come to life:

We have various children running organised weekly playground challenges. We also have a moon ball station in the P3-7 playground, basketball nets in our infant playgrounds and we are awaiting our P3-7 basketball nets to be installed.

Learning through landscapes have also been involved in discussing ways we can bring our pupils' other ideas to life and we are currently exploring costings for these. We'd like to ask if anyone has any guttering, tarps, rope (quy rope), tent pegs or any other items they are willing to donate that we could use for outdoor learning/improving playground experiences before we purchase new.

School Travel Plan Development

We are aware that for working parents, or those who live further from the school it can be challenging to walk children to school. We would like to ask that children walk or cycle to school wherever possible.

If you need to bring your child to school by car, we'd advise that you do this between 8:00 and 8:25 as they will be able to access breakfast club in the dining hall before children are taken out into the playground at 8:30am. This will ensure that we don't have the same issues from 8:30 - 8:50 when we continually get reports of people parking all along Harburn Road which can then block traffic from flowing and increase risk to pedestrians.

After the spring holiday we will be launching our JRSO (Junior Road Safety Officer) group who will begin to pull together our School Travel Plan. We are seeking any parents/carers/grandparents who might be interested in attending and working with children and staff in school in this development. This is likely to take place on a Monday afternoon for approximately 1 hour every few weeks. Staffing Update

Last month, Mrs Purdie officially took early retirement. Mrs Purdie, who has worked at the school for many years, will be very much missed but we wish her all the best and very happy and healthy retirement from education as she goes on to begin a new exciting chapter!

We held interviews to fill Mrs Purdie's permanent position and Miss Carmichael (fixed term P3b teacher) was the successful candidate and will now be appointed permanently but will remain in her position in P3b. Mr Jeffrey has now taken over full time as Primary 7a teacher for the remainder of the year and Mrs Hogarth remains in Primary 4b full time. Miss McGregor has also joined us fixed term to provide additional teaching support across the school.

Following recent interviews, an additional Pupil Support Worker called Miss Turrell will also be joining us soon. We look forward to having Miss Turrell joining the team to provide additional support.







Equity—Sustainability Station

We now have a sustainability station at the front of the school. The school clothing bank kindly supported us to get an initial stock in place and we have a parent helper who is going to be working with a group of our pupils to organise this and have it available to our families very soon. However, we could use more items of different sizes. **If you have any uniform items your child has outgrown, please send these in and our pupils can add these to our stock.** Our Sustainability Group will then arrange to have these laundered, packaged up and available to families.

We also continue to provide fruit and healthy snack to children who may need one as part of our Cost of the School day & Pupil Equity supports.
