PLANNING AND LEARNING

The children have been continuing to explore the focus of "families" so far in the nursery where the children have been using what they have learned about different types of families, homes and people and incorporating it into their play. This has involved a lot of role play with the babies and other children in the house corner, building homes and beds for each other in the construction area and completing daily tasks such as chores, shopping etc. The children have been using these skills to then look after our Parkhead Panda at home for a few days and sharing these experiences through seesaw.

With the change in the weather recently, the children have become interested in the season of Autumn and the changes that occur during this time. The children went on a local walk around our community to collect natural resources including leaves, twigs, acorns, conkers etc. These have been used within our play and to make collages and pictures of our homes. Throughout this interest, the children will continue to learn about the changes that occur in the leaves, the animals that they may see, the temperature and the nights becoming darker. This will lead into investigating hibernation and the things may need in the Autumn during play i.e. warmer clothes, torches etc. We aim to continue this throughout the month of October and begin to explore Halloween before our Halloween party and stay and play on the 31st of October.

Rocco learned how to fly while in Manchester.




