

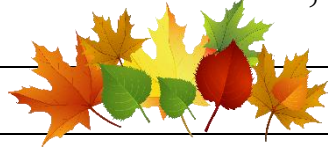

Our Highlights - Looking back at Term 1

Phonics – We have learned all of our letter sounds now and we are getting challenged to spell some words on the magnetic boards. We are learning how to write letters nicely.

Reading – We are looking after our books, without bending them! We were learning to predict what is going to happen next in our story.

Writing – We do green and pink to help us with our writing and we have star writers that do good writing. We are starting to learn how to sound out words and write the letters we hear. We draw detailed pictures.

Listening and talking – We do circle time with Bamboo the panda or Mr Frog.

Numeracy – We have been learning about numbers, halving numbers

Maths – shape and pattern.

IDL – The garden. We were planting and digging in the garden. We were learning about insects and where they live and we even made food chains.



Looking forward to Term 2

Literacy - we are beginning to revise our letter sounds and write small words. We are working on forming letters properly and writing a sentence.

Numeracy - We are learning about adding (using rekenreks, counters, 10 frames, numicon and blocks).

In term 2 so far we have been learning about Autumn and the seasons. We have learned about the months of the year, the days of the week and what each season looks like. We have been recording the weather in Autumn and talking about the different colours, what happens to the trees and describing how it feels. We will continue to explore this and link this to our senses this term. We are also excited to learn about space and the day and night cycle.
